Lubaga South MP-elect Ken Lukyamuzi yesterday engaged police in a hide-and-seek game to escape attempts to block him from walking to the city centre. Aware that as early as 6am, the police had already deployed at shops near his house to report on his movements while others were at the Ndeeba-Nateete Road, Mr Lukyamuzi pretended to be doing rounds in his constituency.

He quickly formed a group of informers whom he sent to spy on the police deployments along his intended route to the city. Armed with information that the police were waiting for him at Ndeeba, Mr Lukyamuzi instead branched off right at Sembule Steel Factory and walked into the sprawling Sembule, Nakaiza and Wankulukuku villages, which threw the pursuers off-track.
