



## Museveni determined to kill Kabaka Mutebi

**Remember last year when Radiomunansi.com revealed to us the “secret government” of Yoweri Museveni? ### HOW IT STARTED

**Time check: 7:45pm**

The MPs arrive at State House. Museveni had already instructed his handlers that once these MPs, some of whom had been feasting on katogo, arrive they straight away be taken to the dining room for supper. Indeed many of them, according to sources, scrambled for chicken thighs, sodas and other eats because they had spent months without eating heavy meals.

“Some of the MPs wanted to even pocket the eats. They claimed that they had spent days without eating reasonable food because they are in campaigns. Some could not even respect the line and started scrambling for food,” a snoop stated, adding that one of the MPs piled four chicken thighs on her plate and one thigh fell on the ground!

After finishing their supper, the MPs at around 9.00pm, were ushered into the conference room. Interestingly, all along they didn’t know the agenda of the meeting although majority thought

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that they were going to be given cash. However, on reaching the meeting room, they only found the ‘ugly face’ of the Anti-Kabaka Bill 2010 (Institution of Traditional or Cultural Leaders Bill 2010) smiling in front of every chair! “We couldn’t believe what we saw. The Bill was scattered all over yet we expected to discuss matters of the campaigns and money!” a source stated. At this juncture, when MPs were murmuring about the strange Bill, government chief whip Daudi Migereko calmed them by explaining to them about the issue. With Brig. Amama Mbabazi in the chair listening, Migereko then asked gender minister Gabriel Opio to take through the caucus the proposed amendments into the Bill.

However, this annoyed members, and according to sources, Bunyole County MP Dombo Emmanuel Lumala shot up on a point of procedure. “I want to ask; is this the reason we are here or something else is coming? Why do we start with such an issue which is after all not urgent? Is this the reason you called us? We travelled several miles to come here hoping there was something serious.” Dombo told the caucus, but Amama Mbabazi replied, “Honourable Dombo, please calm down. Listen. Let the minister explain.” As Opio went through the amendments, Water Minister Maria Mutagamba shot up.

“I am the woman MP for Rakai, NRM district chairperson Rakai and a cabinet minister. I want to tell honorable members that those clauses were smuggled into that Bill. Cabinet never discussed them.” Wakiso woman MP Rose Sseninde chipped in, “over my dead body. I am a Muganda. We as Buganda MPs agreed that we can’t pass it. It is poisonous.

In any case, the speaker adjourned parliament sine die (indefinitely), why do we discuss it when parliament is not on?” she fumed. This attracted criticism from the pro-Anti-Kabaka Bill ministers who told Sseninde off that “he (Ssekandi) adjourned parliament as a Muganda speaker but not as speaker of Uganda.”

### **MUSEVENI ARRIVES**

As more Buganda MPs continued to dust bin the Bill, Museveni all of a sudden appeared in his casual attire, **Military combat uniform**. He immediately cleared his throat and before sitting he roared. “I am talking as the president of Uganda, commander-in-chief, chairman of the Historical High Command and the custodian of the 1995 constitution.

I have risked travelling in the chopper at night because of this urgent Bill which I want passed before the end of this month, *the dictator ordered*, **I hear the speaker shelved it until after elections. I am now directing that the Bill be brought back to parliament and be passed. Now this means all along during the introduction of the bill at State house , some one was communicating to the dictator the progress.**” he reportedly stated. Sources tell us that a furious Museveni told the caucus that while some MPs were saying that the Bill was suicidal for their elections and would also strain relations between Kabaka and Museveni’s government, Museveni reacted angrily. He roared, **“The army council which I chair sat in Karamoja and approved this Bill. The army council wants it passed immediately, “the army council wants it passed**

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immediately”!. **You civilians can’t stop us.** You are mere allies,” sources quoted Museveni as furiously telling off MPs. Some MPs reasoned that by bringing this Bill, they risked being defeated in upcoming elections, while others said it will take a lot of their time yet their opponents are busy campaigning. In fact, MPs like Peter Mutuluza wondered why Museveni summoned them to State House yet his rival Amelia Kyambadde was on the ground campaigning. Mutuluza branded the State House meeting as a plot to defeat them. **“I don’t care whether you (MPs) lose or not. I want this law. You can’t give someone a ladder to climb but after reaching, he turns against you. I see him (Kabaka) moving in Kampala markets (Kikuubo, Kisekka) telling people to vote wisely. Why? So if the Kabaka tells people to vote wisely, that means he is against Museveni? To me it means that now even Museveni knows that a wise man/woman can’t vote him back in office. He is doing this for who? Why is (Kabaka) Mutebi fighting me? What was (Kabaka) Mutebi doing with the key in Lubiri?”** a source quoted a furious Museveni as saying! He went on,

**“On the issue of money (like I hear some people stole Chogm money) I can compromise on that, but someone questioning my state power I won’t look on.** This is not a mere Bill but a stability issue.” At this juncture, all MPs including those who had initially been arguing before his arrival cooled like netted chicken thieves except Lwemiyaga County MP Theodore Sekikubo who dared challenging Museveni. “You have always branded Obote a fool for attacking Kabaka and Lubiri. I am seeing you are doing the same though for you, you are using state power to push laws. **WHAT A GUY, BE MY PRESIDENT MR. HONARABLE T. SEKIKUBO.**

You have tied the man’s hands. You are ruining his kingdom” Ssekikubo fumed, prompting Museveni to react saying, “The Kabaka was attacked when I was still at school. I was not part of government. The referendum on lost counties; was I there?” This **annoyed Sekikubo who shot up according to sources and stated that, “If you are not ruining the kingdom, how did this so-called Sabanyala and Sabaruuli come up?”** *How many Bagandas like this man do we have left?* A furious Museveni then bragged saying, “I am a cattle keeper. For us cattle keepers, we put up fences to prevent cows from straying into neighbors’ gardens and homes. Why is (Kabaka) Mutebi fighting me instead of concentrating on his cultural work? What was he doing with the key?” Museveni vowed to use all means to win the 2011 elections, adding that while Buganda NRM MPs cry over this Bill, this is the time for them to show where their allegiance lies.

## PM NSIBAMBI SHEDS TEARS

Meanwhile, more drama ensued in the caucus as PM Apollo Nsibambi shed tears before MPs. It is said after Museveni directed for its resurrection, Nsibambi’s eyes turned red that he almost shed tears before MPs. “Honorable members, please help me. **STOP CRYING, THIS IS NOT TIME TO CRY, DO SOMETHING MR. MP, DO SOMETHING.** Turn up for parliament business. I want quorum to pass this Bill. I am helpless” he cried as MPs asked him:

“Where are you campaigning? Are you doing any campaigns to call us for those sittings? We are struggling and you call us for sittings?” the MPs reacted to the leader of government business in parliament. “Nsibambi’s eyes turned red. He even started stammering and lost words. He even

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lost English words and started stammering in Luganda,” a snoop stated, adding that most Buganda NRM MPs who attended the meeting including Kiddu Makubuya nearly collapsed in their chairs as Museveni made the anti-Kabaka remarks.

## **SSEKANDI IN STATE HOUSE**

In another development, sources informed us that speaker Edward Ssekandi was also in State House on Thursday. The man from Kyanamukaaka was then given directives to eat his words on suspending the Bill. The dark-skinned man was, according to sources, left speechless as he also wondered what the consequences of passing such a Bill would be on his side since he also comes from a Buganda constituency. We have now learnt that Museveni is going to meet Buganda NRM caucus today (Sunday afternoon) at State House over the Bill after which he will also meet a special cabinet at 8.00pm over the same saga. Interestingly, the vice president Gilbert Bukenya dodged this meeting yet he, together with three other ministers, have been claiming that the Bill was changed.

## **WHAT IS IN THE BILL?**

Sources confirmed to us that much as Museveni was willing to scrap other hot clauses, he wants a tough one barring Kabaka and his agents including institutions like CBS radio from participating in partisan politics. It is said anyone serving Kabaka must be ready for jail if he or she makes any statement that can be interpreted as political although sources added that even the same law is likely to target even those who wear backcloth to symbolise Buganda culture in case they engage in any political activity. “These will all be taken as Kabaka’s agents. Many people are going for jail if the Bill is passed. In fact, Museveni is ready to ascent to it.
