A high-profile meeting was recently convened at Mengo, the seat of Buganda Kingdom, to discuss, among other things, the possibility that key pro-Kabaka recently elected Members of Parliament could be arrested. The February 21 meeting was convened by Buganda’s Katikkiro, J. B. Walusimbi.

“The government wants you to stop inciting citizens, or else you will be dealt with accordingly,” he told the MPs in a lengthy brief, according to sources that attended. Coming at a time when Mengo’s efforts to rally Kabaka-loving subjects to join politics and fight for the kingdom’s demands are yet to yield tangible results, Walusimbi told the MPs that the Inspector General of Police, Maj Gen Kale Kayihura, had called him to, among other things, implore him to prevail over the “unruly MPs”.

“They are inciting people and we are watching them closely,” Kayihura reportedly told Walusimbi. Some outspoken MPs, including newly elected ones, did not attend the meeting, but sent apologies. They include: Betty Nambooze (Mukono municipality), Ssemujju Ibrahim Nganda (Kyadondo East), Moses Kasibante (Rubaga North), Medard Lubega Ssegona (Busiro East), Mathias Mpuuga (Masaka municipality) and old-guard, Erias Lukwago (Kampala Central, now running for Kampala mayor).

Impeccable sources at the meeting have told us that, according to Walusimbi’s brief, Kayihura claimed that the lawmakers were mobilizing youth from Nkobazabongo, the youth wing of Buganda kingdom, to wreck havoc. Saying that the police have been monitoring this group of MPs and a few others, Kayihura reportedly told Walusimbi to

warn all Nkobazabongo youth not to follow the MPs' instructions.

Kayihura reportedly further told Walusimbi to warn the MPs that if they proceed with their plans of using the youths to riot, they will be "arrested".

Kayihura's concern comes at a time when the opposition, which has roundly rejected the outcome of the February 18 presidential election results, has called for peaceful demonstrations to oppose President Yoweri Museveni, even though he was declared winner with 68%.

The opposition is targeting three million Ugandans to join their cause against Museveni's government. However, ironically, in spite of the sour relations between Mengo and NRM the government prior to the elections, including accusations that the kingdom was supporting the opposition, Kabaka Ronald Muwenda Mutebi and the Katikkiro recently congratulated President Museveni upon his victory, especially in Buganda.
