THE National Resistance Movement primary election losers on Thursday diverted the debate on the long awaited CHOGM report and appealed to the President to intervene to save their political careers. **As always the president is the only supreme ruler that everything is appealed to.**

President Yoweri Museveni on Thursday summoned the caucus to State House Entebbe to discuss how to handle the debate on the Commonwealth accountability report in which some cabinet ministers have been accused of misappropriating funds. **He himself Museveni and family misappropriated the funds in question using his VP as a scapegoat**

Debate on the Public Accounts Committee (PAC) report started on Tuesday. Top Government officials including Vice-President Prof. Gilbert Bukenya are implicated in causing loss of money during the Commonwealth summit held in Kampala in 2007. **Museveni and family stole 75% of the CHOGM funds**

According to the report, over sh500b was spent on the summit. The Government had initially planned to spend only sh270b. The major findings in the report included critical roads not repaired in favor of private properties, irregularities in procurement of cars, inflated costs in the beautification projects, roads, media and publicity. **Why has it taken Museveni several years to initiate a commission of inquiry?** Please let's be fooled by these crooks again

Sources at the caucus meeting on Thursday however, say the disgruntled members derailed debate on the report insisting that issues relating to the NRM primaries be solved before other issues are brought in.

But Government Chief Whip Daudi Migereko however, yesterday denied that the MPs derailed the discussion on the CHOGM report which was top on the agenda. "Of-course that is not true. We only agreed that there will be another meeting on Tuesday next week, to discuss and reach a consensus on the Chogm report." **If there is ever going to be a truthful commission, M7 will be the first suspect to be investigated.**
