President Museveni has dismissed suggestions by former spy chief David Pulkol that his government has bungled the disarmament programme in Karamoja and let down the people in the region as falsehoods. Mr Museveni also said his NRM government “cannot and will not lose the 2011 general elections” indicating the computerisation of the voters register would eliminate “rigging by the opposition” among other things. Mr Pulkol’s views were expressed in a Sunday Monitor interview published on July 4.

### **Performance questioned**

But in a no-holds-barred response sent to this newspaper yesterday, Mr Museveni questioned the performance of the former External Security Organization director general while he served in the NRM government as Karamoja affairs minister.

While Mr Museveni agreed that billions of shillings meant for the National Agricultural Advisory Services and for water services in the region was stolen by officials, he said “part of the problem of accountability in Karamoja has been precisely the presence of the illegal guns”

“Auditors and accounting officers could not follow-up, or, at least, used it as an excuse,” Mr Museveni said. While questioning Mr Pulkol’s performance as Karamoja minister, Mr Museveni said that his wife, Janet, whom he appointed to the same portfolio last year, was getting to the root cause of accountability problems.

“[Now, my wife, the Hon. Janet Museveni, in her characteristic meticulous and patient way, visited every sub-county in Karamoja and discovered the massive misuse of this money. She also discovered the use of insecurity by officials and Local elected leaders in Karamoja to cover up this theft and other forms of rot,” the President said.

“The young, dashing, noisy and bombastic Mr Pulkol, while Minister of Karamoja, never did this. It is the Pulkol-type, therefore, that has always let down Karamoja,” Mr Museveni wrote. The army has been accused of human rights violations while carrying out the forced disarmament exercise but the President insists the exercise will continue to pacify the whole region.

Mr Pulkol who worked for the NRM government has since joined the opposition Uganda People’s Congress as its deputy head of its mobilisation wing. Mr. Museveni dismissed suggestions by Mr Pulkol that “the NRM will be voted out of power”. “That will not happen Mr. Pulkol, whatever the permutations of your opportunist and reactionary groups,” Mr Museveni hit back.

“Even the small portion of the votes the opposition has been ‘getting’ (read stealing) will greatly diminish on account of the computerization of the voters’ register. The multiple registrations the opposition has been using, working in partnership with the corrupt anti-NRM public officials is no longer possible. We have discovered that in some areas they even created ‘ghost’ polling stations where NRM would get zero,” the President wrote.
